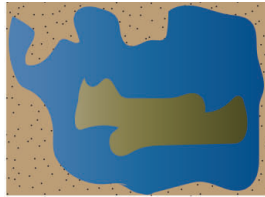

and the Island**



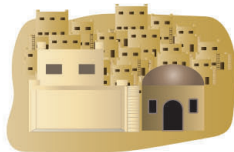
Note on BG1 Land, Sea and Island:

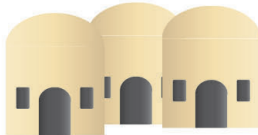

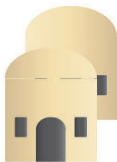

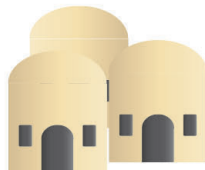
