#### **SUMMER YOUTH CAMP POLICIES-2023**

Over the years we have encountered many different experiences, questions, and even some problems while at camp. The following items are stated in an effort to help you better understand our policies and your responsibilities at camp:

- 1. Camp will officially begin when you leave the church for camp location.
- 2. The primary purpose of all adult workers is to assist the camp director in leading the campers in spiritual, social, and physical growth. Therefore, all workers must maintain a proper Christian attitude and conduct while at camp.
- 3. Other adult workers' policies include these:
  - A. All adult workers must complete MMBC volunteer screening policies prior to the first Sunday in June!
  - B. All workers will be assigned as team leaders or helpers on the first day of camp.
  - C. No workers may change teams or alter the program without Director's permission.
  - D. Any worker planning to be away from camp should notify the Director of plans before he or she is assigned to a job.
  - E. All workers must stay with their teams during all team activities.
  - F. All workers will attend all Bible studies and all camp meetings unless cleared with the Director.
  - G. All workers will work their assigned duties unless permission to substitute is given.
  - H. Adults who are concerned about breaches of camp policies and rules should communicate those concerns to the camp director so that they can be appropriately dealt with.
- 4. It is **GREATLY ENCOURAGING** to have the campers receive mail from friends and relatives. Therefore, we suggest that you write letters to your camping teen before camp and mail them so the teens can receive them while at camp.

- 5. There will be no tobacco of any form tolerated by adults or teens.
- 6. There will be no non-prescription drugs of any form tolerated by adults or teens.
  \*All medications must be turned in to camp nurse and the nurse will dispense all medicines/first aid.
- 7. There will be no P.D.A. (Physical Display of Affection) of any kind by any workers or teens.
- 8. All workers will use either the KJV, ESV or N.I.V. version of the Bible for all memory work so as to insure unity among the campers in studying the Word of God.
- 9. Our Dress Code for camp is as follows:
  - 1. Campers and adults are expected to strive to dress according to Christian modesty that does not seek to draw attention to ourselves or consider beauty as outward adornment of the body, but rather strive to adorn ourselves with godliness shown through good works (1 Timothy 2:9-10).
  - 2. During the day campers and adults should wear: regular T-shirts with sleeves, loose athletic shorts or shorts made of sturdier fabric.
  - 3. Campers and adults are encouraged to wear sturdy shoes during the day to protect their feet and ankles from injury during camp activities, which will require physical activity such as running and jumping.
  - 4. Campers and adults are encouraged to dress appropriately for evening worship to communicate an atmosphere that is respectful and reverent.
  - 5. Boys and girls campers and adults will not be swimming in mixed company, but swimwear should still communicate modesty and adequately cover the wearer's body. Boys should wear swimming trunks and are only permitted to not wear a shirt while they are swimming. Girls should invest in a one-piece bathing suit to bring to camp if they do not own one. If a girl is not wearing a one-piece bathing suit she will be required to wear a t-shirt while swimming.
- 10. Sweet Shop cards are issued and will show the camper's total money that is turned in at camp. There will be two Sweet Shops per day. Money spent will be marked on the camper's card and leftover money will be refunded the last day of camp.
- 11. Adults and students \*not previously registered\* who wish to visit the camp during the week must receive permission from the camp director prior to arrival.
- 12. Total cooperation is expected from adults and teens alike. The Camp Director reserves the right to send home any camper that consistently reacts in a negative fashion to policy.
- 13. MMBC and participating churches are not responsible for lost or stolen items. Special care should be taken by adults and students to keep track of their belongings and confirm that they go home with all of their own belongings after the event.

All medication must be in its original container and labeled with student's full name, name of medication, prescription strength and dosage frequency. No medication can be administered by camp nurse without this info. Please place all meds in a bag with students name on it.
CAMP ARRIVAL/ REGISTRATION	MMBC will depart for camp on Sunday June 18th after the morning worship Campers need to arrive at MMBC at 8:30 a.m. and place their luggage in the fellowship hall. While students go home for lunch, their luggage will be loaded. Students must return to MMBC by 1:00 PM to depart for camp (NO LUGGAGE WILL BE LOADED AT THIS TIME). Students are to bring their carry on luggage only at this time.
